A **Cloverbud** is a registered 4-H member between the ages of 6 and 8 as of January 1st of the current 4-H year. Due to their young age and also taking risk management into consideration, cloverbuds are only able to participate in Exploring 4-H projects as set out and facilitated by the volunteer leader.

Cloverbuds should be encouraged to participate in the traditional elements of the 4-H year including Communications, Community Service and Agriculture Awareness Activities and participate at regional and provincial events (at the discretion of the regional and provincial Councils) However, they are not able to compete in any regional or provincial competitions.

Cloverbuds are not permitted to participate in any of the livestock projects other than activities which fall under the Cloverbud Project (see official Cloverbud Policy for more details).

Project Completion Requirements (PCR)

- Complete Skill Builder 1, along with at least five (5) other Skill Builder activities
- Create at least two (2) tangible items that will be on display at Achievement Day
- Member Profile Book (*with completed pages reflective of project*)

NOTE: Although the group may do activities together, project members are expected to document & display their own project/activity items at Achievement Day.

4-H Year Completion

The following must be on display at the Club Achievement Day in order to complete the 4-H year

- Complete the **PCR's (Project Completion Requirements)** as outlined above
- Complete a **Communication** (public speaking) Project
- Complete a **Community Service** Activity
- Complete an **Agriculture Awareness** Activity
- Complete the **Member Documentation** (4) pages found in your Portfolio or on the website

Exhibition Requirements

Members may choose to submit one (1) item from their project work to be displayed at fairs and exhibitions.

- The second last Saturday in July each year is the deadline for Members to submit project work and portfolios to their 4-H Specialist for completion and to remain as a member in good standing. Only members in good standing can participate in summer exhibitions and be nominated /apply for special awards.
