

Crochet I & II Project Information Page



This project is designed to teach members the basic steps required to crochet. Crochet is a form of needlework looped stitches are formed with a single thread and a hooked needle. Members will be introduced to the tools used, how to choose the correct yarns/thread for the intended item and how to follow patterns. Members will also learn several basic stitches that can be used for both beginner and more advanced crochet work.

Project Completion Requirements (PCR)

EASY STEPS TO CROCHET I

Four (4) samples

- Foundation Chain Stitch (apprx. 10cm in length)
- Single Crochet Stitch (apprx. 10cm in length)
- Double Crochet Stitch (apprx. 10cm in length)
- Fringe
- Scarf (must use the double crochet stitch and measure 22 stitches wide and 40cm in length with fringe on both ends of the scarf. Members may use more than one colour if they wish)

EASY STEPS TO CROCHET II

- One (1) sample
 - A round doily made using at least two colours of knitting worsted yarn, for a diameter of 6"
- Hat & Mittens
- Project Page specific to Home Ec or Life Skill Projects
