This project is designed to be fun and encourage creativity as you learn the art of cake decorating. Many occasions such as birthdays, anniversaries, weddings, and other holiday occasions are examples of where the art of cake decorating can be used.

Cake Decorating can serve as a creative outlet for all ages...the mastery of this skill is one that members and leaders alike will carry with them for years to come. The art of Cake Decorating does require practice and persistence...but the outcome is worth the investment!

Project Completion Requirements (PCR)

- Attend Cake Decorating Project Day on April 15, 2023
- Decorated Baked Cake
 - The cake can be either round or square in shape and measure 8" - 9" (20.0 - 22.5 cm) in size, single layer.
 - Cake must be decorated using butter cream icing and at least three (3) different tips.
- Tip and Border Tray
 - The tip and border tray shall display samples of both the single design and the borders that can be created using three (3) different decorating tips.
- Project (1) Page specific to Home Economic or Life Skill Projects

4-H Year Completion

- **The following must be on display at the Club Achievement Day in order to complete the 4-H year**
- Complete the PCR's (Project Completion Requirements) as outlined above
- Complete a Communication (public speaking) Project
- Complete a Community Service Activity
- Complete an Agriculture Awareness Activity
- Complete the Member Documentation (4) pages found in your Portfolio or on the website

Exhibition Requirements

Decorated Cake (6" or 7", round or square cake form)

Members shall exhibit a decorated cake form using butter cream icing. Design must display three (3) decorating tips.

Please Note: This item is to be freshly decorated for each exhibition (Cake form may be re-used)

Members are strongly encouraged to participate in the 4-H Classes at PEI Fairs & Exhibitions.
