## Project Information Page



Members choosing to explore this project will use all previously learned skills to create a one or two piece dress from a pattern of their choice! Members will also have the opportunity to practice judging - a skill that ensures members learn how to differentiate good sewing techniques from poor sewing techniques.

### Project Completion Requirements (PCR)

- One piece dress **OR** Two piece dress (top and skirt)
- Photo Wearing the Dress
- Judging \*
- Project (1) Page specific to Home Ec or Life Skill Projects

**\*Judging:** To ensure that members learn to tell good sewing techniques from poor, it is encouraged that you practice judging of sewing articles early in the project (before you start your apron, sleep pants, boxers or tote). Your leader will supply several sewing articles displaying both good and poor construction details for you to judge. This activity will give you some on knowledge in evaluating well made and poorly made garments. Use the judging resource page when practicing this activity.
